ABOUT DON BOSCO

Don Bosco (John Bosco) was an Italian Roman Catholic Priest, educator and writer of the 19th Century. While working in Turin, where the population suffered many of the effects of industrialization and urbanization, he dedicated his life to the betterment and education of street children, juvenile delinquents, and other disadvantaged youth.

About a century and a half before the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child- which coined the immortal phrase ‘best interest of the child’ – came into force (1990), Don Bosco, the educator brought into being an educational practice in which the child is at the centre. When John Bosco lived in Europe, many boys were orphaned and poor. Without families and religious training, these boys often got into fights, used bad language, and stole, hurting others. John Bosco might have been like that, too, if it hadn't been for his devout mother. John was the youngest son of a peasant family. His father died when John was two, and the family became very poor. As a youngster, John taught religion to other boys and got them to go to church. His acrobatics and magic tricks fascinated them. Encouraged by a priest, John entered the seminary wearing clothes provided by charity. Priests at the seminary saw that John was a natural leader and encouraged him to use his gifts to keep other young people out of trouble. John started gathering boys together on Sunday for a day in the country. They would begin with Mass, followed by breakfast and games. The afternoon would include a picnic, a catechism lesson, and evening prayers. The group grew larger because John Bosco loved the boys. He made each one feel important. He had a gift for handling difficult boys.

John Bosco spent so much time working that people who knew him well became worried about his health. They said he should take more time for rest and sleep. John replied that he'd have enough time to rest in heaven.

“Right now,” he said, “how can I rest? The devil doesn't rest from his work.” He developed teaching methods based on love rather than punishment, a method that became known as the ‘**Salesian Preventive System**’

DON BOSCO VEEDU AN OVER VIEW



Don Bosco is a non-governmental, non-profit, non-political, social and charitable organization registered under Societies' Registration Act. It is an organization working with street children, neglected children, the destitute children, working children, the slum children, the refugees and other marginalized children and youth. We initially started working with a night shelter Home for street children at Shanghumugam in 1991. The children are provided with food, shelter, clothing, individual care, education and vocational training. After having completed 24 years of service we could proudly say that we have reached out to lakhs of neglected and at Risk children through our Centre based services, Community based services and Society based services.

Vision

To create a child friendly society by collectively acting as catalysts to transform people to think and act in favour of children especially those at risk.

Mission

To reach out and rescue children and youth at risk; to care for them; to inspire them towards a dignified life protected from abusive situations, to advocate on their behalf, to restore their right and to be catalysts in the formation of a child friendly society

History

Don Bosco's work for street children in Trivandrum began in May 1991. It started as a night shelter Home for street children and youth in rented facilities at Bishop Pereira Hall, Shangumugam, and later on in Chalai Market. A society was registered on 9th December 1991 under the name of 'Trivandrum Don Bosco Veedu Society'. In 1994, some land and building were bought at Manacaud and the shelter home was shifted there with the name 'Don Bosco Veedu'. Later on, in collaboration with Latin Arch Diocese of Trivandrum, Don Bosco center, Manacaud was constructed and in 1999 some land was bought near railway station, Thampanoor, to build and shift the shelter home to a more accessible place for children. Don Bosco Nivas was inaugurated on January 31st 2002. A railway rescue booth for children was constructed on the railway platform in 2009.

SHELTER HOME

CENTER BASED SERVICES




Don Bosco Nivas is an open shelter home for rescued children from streets and other risk situations. Food, Shelter, Clothing, Medical Care, advocacy, therapeutic and vocational training, Basic Education, recreational and talent development programmes, Counselling, Home Placement, and Institutional Placement are some of the services made available to the beneficiaries from here. This year we could provide shelter to 320 children.

The Open Shelter Home for children is situated in the heart of the city and just 300 meters away from major hubs like Central Railway station and Bus Terminal. It is registered under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2000. It functions as a short stay (transitional) home. We link children with their own families or long serving institutions for care, protection, education and development.



“I hail from a poor family at Puthukottai, Tamil Nadu. My life has been changed by the intervention of Don Bosco. Now I am happy to attend school along with my brothers and friends”.

Thirupathi is a 16 years old boy from Puthukottai, Tamil Nadu. On his way to Kozhikode to find a job, he was picked up by Don Bosco staff and provided shelter. Our staff contacted Puthukottai CHILDLINE and they traced his family. With the help of CHILDLINE and CWC, he has been provided with a good facility to stay and study without money requirement. The CWC has offered help also for Thirupathi's siblings. Now Thirupathi is happy to resume his education.



CHILDLINE is a national 24x7 emergency helpline outreach service for children in need of care and protection with its toll free number 1098. CHILDLINE India Foundation, the nodal agency of the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development provides the necessary support for the smooth functioning of the various activities with its vision to make a child - friendly nation that guarantees the rights and protection of all children. CHILDLINE reaches out to every child in need and ensure their rights and protection through the four 'C's; viz, Catalyze, Collaborate, Connect & communicate.

Being a voluntary charitable society with good network and services for the marginalized children of the society, Don Bosco has contributed much for the children at risk situation through the CHILDLINE project, functioning as the Collaborative agency for the district of Trivandrum. We are proud to say that Don Bosco Nivas is the first CHILDLINE centre in Kerala.

The local authorities, allied systems, NGO partners, volunteers and well wishers had rendered a great support for its

effective functioning. We thank the Ministry of Women and Child Development and CHILDLINE India Foundation for the financial and monitoring support. The Social Welfare Department, Government of Kerala, CAB, Resource Organisations and Volunteers have contributed significantly for the effective running of CHILDLINE network in the district.

SKILL TRAINING - DB TECH

CENTER BASED SERVICES



DB Tech Trivandrum, who is a partner in the national DB Tech network of Don Bosco skill training centres, is continuing to shape careers of youth who have dropped out of education. The young women and men folk of the neighbourhood are empowered through skill training. The training helps them to earn a livelihood through employment in establishments. To enable them to gain a foothold in the competitive job market, DB Tech helps them acquire the required livelihood and soft skills in an environment of learning and mentoring that is responsive to the individual's emotional and developmental needs. The short term skill training programme consists of three months of training in

different industries.


At present the skill development programmes are conducted by us in **BPO** and **Hospitality management**. In the current year **194** students have successfully completed the courses from our institute and majority of them have been placed in good jobs

In the future we are planning to turn DB Tech into a fully fledged Skill training institute in the domains of Hospitality and BPO.

RAILWAY RESCUE BOOTH



CENTER BASED SERVICES

The 'Railway Rescue Booth' on Platform II of Trivandrum Central Railway Station in partnership with Railway Protection Force (RPF) and Government Railway Police provide emergency assistance, care and protection to depressed women and children reaching Trivandrum. The centre is continuing to provide help to hundreds of children and women who seek emotional support, referral services, rehabilitation and shelter assistance. The centre also turns out to be a source of public awareness creation on child rights and child protection mechanism existing in the State of Kerala. Over 200 children have been rescued through the help booth and restored to their parents.

Childhood Regained!

We found a child with shabby clothes and seemed not to have eaten for long at the railway platform engaged in begging. From the interaction with the accompanying lady (*Chettiamma*) we were unable to ascertain whether the child belonged to her. The child along with the lady was brought to Don Bosco Nivas. As trafficking for begging was a possibility we asked her to produce documents and provided shelter for the child at Child Welfare Council. And we circulated the information of found child into our network.

On 14 July, 2014 Police from Thiruvalla informed that Mr. Siva filed a missing complaint of his daughter *Vaigeswary*. Siva native of Andhra Pradesh said that *Chettiamma* and her husband Raju had casual conversation with the family on a day the child was found missing. The police traced Raju in Andhra Pradesh and apprehended him and his wife. With the help of CWC and Thiruvalla police we restored the child to its own Parents who were overwhelmed to meet the child. The police initiated proceedings against *Chettiamma* and her husband.



CHILDMISS

To strengthen the Juvenile Justice System by making the child visible and promoting action in the interest of children, Don Bosco Young at Risk (YaR) forum has developed ChildMISS web portal. It is a Nation-wide project of YaR Forum in collaboration with various Government and Non-Government Agencies, to trace missing children and restore them back home. ChildMISS (Child



Management Information System and Services) is an online comprehensive Child Tracking System for effective data management, monitoring and reporting. It contributes to speed, process, struc-

ture, knowledge and services for the care, protection and development of children. It is a web based software tool to assist both government and non-governmental organizations to document all the ser-

vices and follow up in a single window system to enhance their mission for children at risk more effectively and efficiently.

The ultimate aim of Child MISS is to create a 'Child Safety Net'. It is vital infor-

mation of children in difficult circumstances, which will assist the networking organizations to strengthen the role of advocacy through legal provisions and law enforcements, review and reform child policy development, offer psychological counselling to children and parents, and raise the community consciousness and collaboration to create safe environment for children.

Trivandrum Don Bosco Veedu Society is a member of YaR Forum and is using the tool for documentation in our centres.

RESEARCH AND DOCUMENTATION CENTRE

Research and Documentation Centre has a well furnished library on books related to different categories of marginalized children and youth. The intention of this documentation and research centre is to provide knowledge and information to those interested and to maintain healthy social work practice with scientific temper. **Recently, Participatory Action Research (PAR) an approach to research in communities that emphasizes participation of children and action which seeks to under-**

stand the world by trying to change it, collaboratively and following reflection, has been carried out by Don Bosco Trivandrum with the help of Don Bosco National YaR Forum. The Aim of the research is to make the Centre as 'Child Centered Centre'. The centre facilitates the child to find and solve their own issues and become managers of their own problems.

CHILDLINE OUTREACH SERVICES

CHILDLINE outreach service has played a major role in conscientising the community on problems that children face in the present day society. Spreading Child rights awareness, protecting children from abuse and mal-treatment, timely interventions on behalf of needy children, transferring knowledge on the 24 hour helpline for children; CHILDLINE has become a companion to the children of Trivandrum District. Methods used for awareness are direct interaction with the target group, conducting classes for different groups, meeting with police officers and Panchayat personnel, participation in child related programmes, notice, stickers, and brochures distribution, cooperating with other NGOs and participating in program where children and public get awareness about CHILDLINE, displaying CHILDLINE advertisements in banners, posters and flex, open houses in which children's participation is ensured.

Anti child labour day

The Society observed the Anti-child labour day on June 12, 2014 in a fitting manner. The inaugural

function was organised at Manacaud Girls High School. Posters related to child protection prepared by Don Bosco CHILDLINE with the help of Social Justice Department were released by the school children during the assembly. The posters are meant to be put up in every classroom of every school in the State. A pledge against child labour was also taken by the 1500 children

at Manacaud Girls High School. A vehicular campaign spreading the message of child rights was flagged off from the school at around 9.30am. The mike announcement and distribution of leaflets covered a major portion of the rural areas of Trivandrum District.



International Missing Children's Day

The Society in collaboration with LES and support agency Thiruvnanthapuram, conducted mass awareness programme on International Missing children's day and showed solidarity to the children who were kidnapped by Bokko Haram. We made a sand sculpture and a candle light vigil at Sanghumugom beach on 25th

May, 2014. Many visitors to the beach pledged solidarity and awareness leaflets and notices were distributed. The students from Assumption college changanassery housed a skit on child abuse spreading awareness.



CHILDLINE SE DOSTI CAMPAIGN

We conducted an awareness and inaugural function of CHILDLINE SE DOSTI (child rights week observance) campaign with the help of CHILDLINE support agency (TSSS) at Pallithura HSSS. Fr. Philip Parakkatt, member Child Rights Commission



inaugurated the function, the school leader presided over the function, Fr. Lenin, Director TSSS, School Head Master, the teachers and the students were present in the function. A signature campaign and Dosti band tying was also done as part of the program. A tree was also

planted as to show the responsibilities of each child to the environment. Train awareness also was a major program in which the team travelled extensively and spread awareness to passengers in trains. On 13 November 2014, a team of Don Bosco travelled in different trains from Varkala to Parassala spreading awareness and over 3000 passengers and 100 officials were directly given awareness

Exhibition at Railway Cabin

On 14.11.2014 (Children's Day) we organized an exhibition cum awareness program at our railway cabin at Thiruvananthapuram railway station to provide awareness to the public on child's issues. Many passengers visited the exhibition and many pledged their willingness to be friend of CHILDLINE by tying the dosti band.



International Girl Child Day

CHILDLINE Thiruvananthapuram organized International Girl Child day celebration at St. Philomena's G.H.S Poonthura as the part of International Girl Child day in collaboration with Loyola and TSSS. The programme inaugurated with lighting the lamp by Rev. Msgr. Eugin H. Pereira (Vicar General of Latin archdiocese Trivandrum). The main highlight of the day was

presidential address delivered Ms. Nooba, school leader. The School HM, Rev. Sr. Teresa Augustin, Dist. and Collab coordinators of CHILDLINE Trivandrum gave felicitation addresses. The children took initiative and formed into 'SAVE' letters giving message to save girl children.



Sthreejyothi

It is an association of women folk of Karimadom Colony formed to work towards the empowerment of women and transformation of Society through its intervention. Through the guidance and support of Don Bosco Veedu Society, the members organize literacy classes for illiterate women, form self help groups and run self employed micro business activities and generate income for their livelihood. They also are in-

involved in organizing medical camps, summer camps, recreational and talent development programmes for the people of the colony.

This year Sthree Jyoti arranged a one day seminar on Domestic Violence. The seminar was lead by members of women's Commission and

from Women Development Corporation. 63 *sthreejyothi* members were present in the seminar.



COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES

Dropout Prevention

Studies have shown that there is high number of dropouts among the school going children of the Karimadom slum. This is due to lack of motivation, lack of follow up from parents, lack of space in homes and lack of facilities and support systems. Don Bosco Trivandrum has intervened favorably and has started an evening class everyday from 04:30 PM to 06:30 PM. The stu-

dents from class I to X are provided conducive places for revision and study of daily lessons. The tuition classes are conducted at the Government Community Hall, Karimadom slum.



Scholarship

In collaboration with other socially responsible institutions and individuals, Don Bosco Veedu has supported many children and youth to attain good education. Scholarship to good students with financial difficulty is granted after proper identification of the children. Scholarship is mainly provided to higher secondary students as they require

more financial support comparing to lower class students. Give India had supported scholarship to over forty children identified through child helpline during the financial year.



Medical Camp & Blood Donation Camp

Lack of nutrition and hygiene sometimes become a cause among slum dwellers to contract illnesses. Don Bosco as part of its community involvement conducted medical camps and free supply of medicines and thus still plays a vital role in improving the health conditions of the people of Karimadom.

With the help of Suhruth.com a social network Don Bosco conducted

a blood donation camp in our center on 26th June 2014. Adv. A Sampath MP inaugurated the camp and 47 people donated blood.



SUCCESS 4 SUCCESS

‘Education imparted has serious lacunae’ A study made on school going children in the society of Kerala says so. Holistic and integrated formation of the children does not take place in schools. The grade oriented competitive focus on academics on the part of



the School authorities and parents produce unhealthy and emotionally imbalanced children.

“Success for Success” (S4S) is a package from Don Bosco aimed at striking the roots for providing awareness and educates child rights to children, parents, teachers and other stake holders. Providing awareness to all people who

deal with children is the best way to protect and promote child rights. Personality development, Study Methods, Self Esteem, Self Confidence, Motivation, Leadership, Communication, Understanding Adolescence, Child Rights & Acts, child responsibilities, Handling child Abuse issues, Drug Addiction, handling stress and suicidal tendencies among children etc. are some of the topics covered under the scheme.

SUMMER CAMP – MAMBAZHAM 2014




Summer vacation is a time when children can get into problems especially in households where parents are working and have no time for their children and this year too Don Bosco conducted summer camp for poor children in and around Karimadom Slum. There were over 75 children who participated in the Summer Camp. The Summer Camp this year was named *Mambazham*.

The inaugural function of the camp took place on 24th April, 2014. The function

was graced by Jyotsna, a well known singer of Kerala. Cine and serial artist Mr. Biju Varghese also participated in the inaugural ceremony and handed over the camp flags to different teams. Fr. Francis Karackatt, the Rector of Don Bosco Manacaud presided over the inaugural ceremony. The camp consisted of different classes which imparted values and lots of talent development programmes and fun and frolic for children. The Camp ended with a picnic and School material distribution to all the children.

Child Safety Message Posters



After the successful completion of spreading 10 different child safety messages to the Government Schools in Kerala last year which benefitted over 36 lakhs of school children, Trivandrum Don Bosco Veedu Society with the help of Social Justice Department and Education Department has floated a project for making and distributing English posters to all CBSE, ICSE schools and PHCs in Kerala. With this, the child safety messages are expected to be disseminated to all children in Kerala with message to contact CHILDLINE when they are in need of help and support.

Rapid Assessment Survey – The Aftermath

Don Bosco Veedu Society conducted a Rapid Assessment Survey (RAS) within Thiruvananthapuram Corporation limits to estimate the number of Street involved children with financial support from the Social Justice Department. The results confirm that the capital city is home to more than 100 street children. And it was found that there are 38 girls below the age

of eight and those above 11 years are 8 in number. A majority of the children were from Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, and Rajasthan, and a few were from Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh.

The results of the survey were presented before the Social Justice Department and the Department has ordered the starting of Open shelter homes with railway booths

at Ernakulam, Kozhikodu and Palakkad.

Another impact of the study was that the details were reported in *The Hindu*, a leading daily on 3rd December, 2014. The Kerala Child Rights Commission took a *suo motu* case and has asked the Social Justice Department to conduct the same study in all the districts of Kerala in order to make plans for caring for such children.

Speedy Justice – POCSO Act

Bindu (given name) aged 12 years was sexually abused by her father during the Christmas vacation when he had taken the child home to *Peroorkada* from a child care home where she was studying. (Dec. 2013). On 18th January 2014, a teacher from her School called to CHILDLINE office and informed about the issue. The teacher came to know about the issue when it was revealed to her by the caretaker of the child at the children's home who said that Bindu used to talk in her sleep, asking her father not to harm her. Our Team visited the school and met the teacher and counselor. They accompanied the teacher and counselor to the children's

home and met the girl. Our staff counseled the child and she revealed that she was abused by her father.

As per the advice of CWC member, we contacted Poojappura police station and a WSI and a WPC came and took her statement in the presence of CHILDLINE Coordinator. The Police took FIR and the girl underwent medical examination and the abuser was arrested. Bindu's case is the second conviction in the State of Kerala and the first in the District of Trivan-

drum under Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO)-2012. The Sessions court awarded life sentence to the abuser on 24.01.2015. Though speedy justice is a dream in India, this can be considered a case of speedy justice for a child victim due to our constant follow up and advocacy.
