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Don Bosco was an Italian Roman Catholic priest, educator and writer of the 19th century. While working in Turin, where the population suffered many of the effects of industrialization and urbanization, he dedicated his life to the betterment and education of street children, juvenile delinquents, and other disadvantaged youth. He developed teaching methods based on love rather than punishment, a method that became known as the 'Salesian Preventive System'.

About a century and a half before the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child—which coined the immortal phrase 'best interest of the child'—came into force (1990), Don Bosco, the educator brought into being an educational practice in which the child is at the centre! His homes were full of migrant child workers, young delinquents, juvenile prisoners and orphaned and abandoned children. The kind of youngsters for whom Don Bosco spent his life were largely victims of neglect, exploitation, abuse and those who had been subjected to some form or other of inhuman and degrading treatment. For them life had been joyless, hard and painful; their psyche were damaged, unfortunately, by those close to them -parents, family members, elders, teachers, and then, the exploitative wider world!

Their wounded selves gave vent to their anger against society through destructive and violent actions. They would be on edge at every turn; instead of building they tore down; instead of valuing and nurturing, they disfigured! A century and a half ago, Don Bosco recognized that education is a matter of the heart. Hence he created a transformative climate that would restore trust in those for whom life had not been so kind

In his own time in Italy, he transformed abandoned children, migrant child-workers and the youth of the 'correction homes' into 'honest individuals and contributing citizens' of the state. He achieved this by nursing and healing their damaged selves, on the one hand, and nurtured and brought forth their finer human qualities by recreating a joyful and trusting family atmosphere around them, on the other. Creating this restorative and growth-producing ambience was at the core of the educative system of Don Bosco: the Preventive System or the Pedagogy of Presence. As followers of Don Bosco, We too dare to dream for a more just and humane society for the young at risk of the present society and work towards achieving the same...

Hence we are unable to catch up with them and also we lack sufficiently knowledge to guide them in the perils of the present world.

There is a need for a paradigm shift in our education system and in the way our families and society handle children so that we can influence our children to grow up to be responsible adults who can contribute to their family and nation. All stakeholders like parents, teachers and government needs to keep abreast of the times and intervene without delay into the lives of our children as they are the future generation and we are accountable if they do not grow into responsible freedom.

As a part of the international Don Bosco network, the Trivandrum Don Bosco Veedu Society is a Registered Charitable Society based in the State of Kerala, primarily operating in the District of Trivandrum to support and assist street children and youth; child labourers; child beggars; unaccompanied and lost children; children in conflict with the law; abused children; abandoned children; migrant children, runaways; and children from dysfunctional family environments (Children and youth at Risk).

Vision

To create a child friendly society by collectively acting as catalysts to transform people to think and act in favour of children especially those at risk.

Mission

To reach out and rescue children and youth at risk: to protect them; to restore them; to inspire them towards a dignified life protected from abusive situations, to advocate on their behalf, to restore their rights and to be catalysts in the formation of a child friendly society.



History

In May, 1991, we started as a night shelter for street children and youth in rented facilities at Bishop Pereira Hall, Shankumugham, and later on in Chalai Market. A society was registered on 9th December 1991 named, 'The Trivandrum Don Bosco Veedu Society'. In 1994, a building was bought at Manacaud and the shelter home was named 'Don Bosco Veedu'. Later on, in collaboration with Latin Arch Diocese of Trivandrum, Don Bosco Centre, Manacaud was constructed and in 1999 a property was brought near railway station, Thampanoor, and built a shelter home accessible for children and named as Don Bosco Nivas which was inaugurated on January 31st, 2002.

MAKE A CALL

CHILDLINE is a toll free, 24 hour emergency telephone helpline service for children in distress under the Ministry of Women and Child Development in collaboration with NGOs, academic institutions, the corporate sector & concerned individuals.

The service is run by Don Bosco Veedu Society in Trivandrum District since its inception in the year 2000

the first CHILDLINE in Kerala. The Society has taken great efforts to reach CHILDLINE to all the districts in Kerala. CHILDLINE is the tool through which we reach out to every child in need of care and protection in the district of Trivandrum.





MADE A DIFFERENCE

The ring came at 4 Pm, and the caller said that in his neighbourhood a boy was physically abused by his father. The child was tied to the window by the neck and bashed up brutally.

CHILDLINE team visited the house, rescued the child with the help of police. Provided medical care, temporary shelter and emotional support. On enquiry we found that the child was made to work at home and he was a child out of wedlock. He was treated like a servant.

This case was reported to the CWC, the parent was declared unfit and the child was given in foster care. Now the child is under the care of his foster parents and is happily living a life with foster parents.

Protection from Abuse



Case Study: Saving the Innocent from Fear





Akhila (Given Name) was the adopted daughter of Raman (Given name) and Leela (Given Name). Raman was a peon in a bank and Leela was a house wife. With their savings they decided to build a house. Their daughter fell in love with a

construction worker who came to build their house. The child was abused by the worker. He was a married man deliberately deceiving the child. He also talked badly about the child and her neighbours started to tease the child because of this.

The child sought help from class teacher on this issue, and the class teacher reported this case to CHILDLINE. CHILDLINE rescue team conducted home visit and interacted with the mother. The team informed the mother about the mental stress faced by the child through the emotional blackmail that she received from the abuser. The team also educated the family about legal actions to be taken against the abuser under POSCO Act 2012. They came to office on the very next day, we produced the child and family before the Child Welfare Committee and the child was temporarily sheltered at Nirbaya home.

We referred this case to the Vellarada Police. The Vellarada police arrested the abuser. The child was send back with her adopted parents and child is now attending school without any mental stress.

CHILDLINE SE Dosti



The CHILDLINE Se Dosti campaign 2016 was flagged off in Trivandrum on November 14, 2016. As part of a weeklong celebration we conducted different awareness campaigns at various parts of the city. Taking note of the rise in drug abuse cases among school children; the focus was on

making children aware of the ill effects of drug abuse.

Govt BHS Pettah was host to the inaugural ceremony of the CHIDLINE Se Dosti campaign organised by Trivandrum Don Bosco Veedu Society. The ceremony was witnessed by more than 200 students of the school. Fr Thomas P.D, Director, CHILDLINE Trivandrum delivered the welcome speech; expressing the importance of the cause, and how to stay away from the drug trend. During the function, a poster by the CHILDLINE Trivandrum on 'Say No to Drugs' was released by the school principal Dr Sheeja and handed over to Smt. Sheelakumari, the school headmistress. Both of them spoke on the awareness campaign and the substance abuse issues among children. One of the interns at CHILDLINE, Mr Robin, a Swedish national also graced the occasion with his presence. After the official ceremony, a short video featuring actor Prithviraj called "Road Trip to Hell" by Bodhini was shown to the young audience. Later a quiz competition was conducted by the team, on the topic, with the active participation of the students; every one of them was given prizes too. The quiz focussed on the knowledge of children on drug menace, ill effects of drugs on the body, preventive aspects and legal dimensions of drug problem. Being a quiz programme interest of the children were sustained and providing prizes boosted their attention and more awareness was imparted.

Don Bosco Nivas Shelter Home is situated close to the Central Railway Station and Bus Stand. Through its staff, we reach out to all those vulnerable children who reach the capital. All those unaccompanied children who are contacted by shelter staff, police, Railway Police, Railway Protection Force, Missing Child Search, CHILDLINE volunteers or any concerned persons are brought to the shelter home and provided with food, clothing, medical care, recreation, vocational training and life skill orientation. Don Bosco Nivas functions as a short stay (transitional) home and the children are linked to their own families or long term serving institutions for care, protection and development.

Functional Literacy Classes

The children at the centre are provided with remedial nonformal numeracy and literacy classes (Malayalam, Maths, English, General Knowledge, Hindi and Life Skills Education)

Vocational Training

Micro skill Training, paper bag making, flower making, craft jobs, decorations etc

Counselling Services

Counselling is one of the major tools utilized for helping the marginalized youth and children. Counselling aims at helping children develop relationships, overcome fears and trauma, handle responsibilities and discipline in their lives. Shelter facilitates children with De-addiction meeting, therapeutic sessions, Career Counselling, Life coping skills and Personality development programs in order to make them grow into responsible individuals.

Outreach Centre



Women and Child help was opened on Centre 14th November 2009 on the 2nd Platform of Trivandrum Central Railway Station in partnership with Railway Protection Government Force and Railway Police to provide emergency assistance, care and protection to the needy women and chilreaching dren Trivandrum. The centre has been helpful to hundreds of children and women

who sought emotional support, referral services and rehabilitation assistance. The centre also turns out to be a source of public awareness creation on child rights and child protection mechanism that exist in the State. Hundreds of children who have run away from home, wandering through the railway platform or engaging in begging have been rescued through this outreach centre and provided shelter at Don Bosco Nivas. Outreach staff are present throughout the day at this centre for rescue of children. They also do outreach to other parts of the city and District to identify and rescue such children.

Participatory Action Research

The four rights of children enshrined in the UNCRC convention are survival, development, protection and participation. It is sad to say that participation as a



right of children has not got its importance throughout the world as everyone is used to a 'top-bottom' approach wherein the adult dictates to the child the 'how' and the 'ought' of behaviour.

The Participative Action Research (PAR) is game changer in this scenario of things. Here children are accompanied to grow into freedom and responsibility regarding the choices they make and the care administrators become agents of change in the process.

Diwali Celebration





On 17th October Diwali was celebrated at Don Bosco Nivas. Director Fr. Thomas PD distributed Diwali sweets to the children. The children and staff at Nivas celebrated Diwali by bursting crackers-altogether a special day of happiness for the children at Don Bosco Nivas.

Picnics & Film Show



The children are often given opportunities for picnics and watch movies in theatres which give them freshness and allow them to forget their gruesome past. Annual excursions are also arranged to give them a wider exposure and broader outlook.

dren engaged in preparing the backdrop for the celebration. There were 23 children and 20 staffs who participated in the celebration. On the 2nd September early morning everyone at Don Bosco Nivas gathered together to draw *pookalam* (traditional flower carpet) and decorate the same with flowers. The program was graced by the presence of Rector Fr. Stephen Mukkatil and director Fr. Thomas P.D. Cultural event was organised in which children and the staff participated, and was extraordinary day for all at Don Bosco Nivas. **Onasadya** was served in the dining hall. The Don Bosco Nivas Summer camp was conducted from 18th to 24th May 2016 at Don Bosco Nivas as holiday programme for inmates. It was titled **"Suryakanthi"** – Arise and Go". The camp was officially inaugurated by Fr Thomas P.D, Director, Don Bosco Veedu Society. Welcome address was spoken by Ms Josna George. Words of appreciation were delivered by Mr. Pramod. And to conclude the official ceremony Ms Beena gave the vote of thanks.

Suryakanthi was a breath of fresh air for the inmates at Nivas. They welcomed the move with sincere participation and sheer focus. Each day of the camp was filled with both academic as well as recreational activities. And the organizers made sure that not even a single boy was left out. The daily routine for the camp begian with prayer followed by a morning talk by the coordinators (Mr. Thampi, Ms Mary, Ms Beena and Ms Josna), which included a message for the children. The next 15 minutes were reserved for meditation led by the same team. From 10.30 AM classes were given to the children. Each day had a session on a relevant topic. The classes covered during the camp included: Personal Health & Hygiene, Awareness on Substance (Drug) Abuse, Communicative English, Essential Body Language Tips, and Importance of Education

Various games and co curricular activities were included in the daily sessions. Mainly energizers, action songs and fun games were a part. Some of the most entertaining among them were the following:- Paper fancy dress, Theme based Skit competition, Musical Chair, Elocution, Light Music and Story Telling

The concluding function was attended by Fr Thomas P.D (Director), Biju Simon (Coordinator), Josna George and report submitted by Beena Roy (Care Giver). A few of the children shared their experience and expressed their words of gratitude. The tagline of our camp Suryakanthi was "Arise and Go". And we could inculcate this message into them. All the participants could introspect and realize their inner powers and strengths.

A Portable Biogas Plants was installed in Don Bosco Nivas on 21st March not just to fulfill the purpose of managing food waste in Nivas hygienically and safely, but also to address the energy requirement. It has been proved that waste can be converted into energy in hours! The portable biogas plant presently takes care of 20 % of Nivas energy needs. Just toss in food scraps and animal waste and up to 2 hours of renewable cooking gas is produced in few hours.

Fresh, Healthy and Tasty: The vegetables grown in our organic kitchen garden are fresh, healthy and organic i.e. free from pesticides. The children at Don Bosco Nivas are given chances to be close to nature through this and we inculcate in them eco-friendly values. Bio- gas slurry is the manure used in our organic garden.

DB Tech





Don Bosco Veedu, Manacaud, one of the centres of Don Bosco Veedu Society is a Skill Training Centre working under the banner of DB Tech India, the leading NGO engaged in livelihood training in India. It is organized with the help of corporate giants like Accenture, Bosch, Taj Group of Hotels etc.

The DB Tech programme is a short term (3 months) skill training programme conducted by us at Don Bosco Veedu. The aim of the programme is to provide a skill and certify the same to those youth of the Trivandrum district who are less educated (minimum 10th grade pass) and are from poor and vulnerable back grounds. These youth often are not able to get into a career due to lack of education and due to lack of certified skills.

Community Based Services

The Don Bosco Veedu Society as a child care organization is engaged in various child welfare and development activities and child rights promotional advocacy programmes. We are also the implementing agency (Collaborative Agency) for CHILDLINE in Trivandrum district. During the last one year we have provided variety interventions such as medical, shelter, repatriation, rescue, sponsorship, emotional support, and counselling to over 1200 children across the district. There were campaigns initiated against child begging and child labour in partnership with various Government Departments and NGOs. The street plays, vehicular campaigns, display of banners and posters, distribution of pamphlets, leaflets, stickers, etc. and visual and print media coverage have imparted awareness to thousands of people on issues faced by children and solutions for the same. We have reached missing children related and drug prevention posters across the district of Trivandrum.

International Missing Children's Day



The Trivandrum Don Bosco Veedu Society conducted a mass awareness programme on International Missing children's day on May 25, 2016 at Don Bosco Nivas, Trivandrum. The programme aimed at sensitizing the rickshaw drivers of Trivandrum city with the cooperation of Thampanoor police station and CHILDLINE Trivandrum. More than 70 auto rickshaw drivers registered for the innovative venture to trace missing children. A *Whatsapp* group named *autokoottam* was inaugurated to provide information about found children while rickshaws ply the streets of the city

New School Bags for New School Year

Awareness materials were distributed among children. Time table cards with CHILDLINE message were also distributed. All children took pledge against child labour and promised to help in eradicating child labour. Around 2000 were given awareness through this programme

There was awareness & announcement conducted at other venues as well; short film festival venue at Kairali theatre, Thampanoor bus stand, St. Xavier's High School Peyad and at Loyola College.

Survey on Drug Dependency Among School Children in Trivandrum

Trivandrum Don Bosco Veedu Society in association with BREADS, Bangalore conducted a survey to find the prevalence of drug abuse among the school children. The survey was conducted in 60 different schools in Trivandrum District. The data where collected from three different zones ie, Rural, Urban and Coastal area. The survey covered 1800 students and it was found that 30% of children are addicted to dugs in the district of Trivandrum. Projects are being planned to thwart this menace.

Balajyothi
